Public Statement re Scotland Campus September 9-10, 2024

There has been recent talk in local media of a federal contract through the Department of Homeland Security and other federal agencies that an RFP has been issued to find contractors to provide transitional services to unaccompanied minors who are coming into the United States who may be seeking to be united or reunited with their families and/or guardians.

In recent weeks, Greene Township has received zoning questions and inquiries regarding the Scotland Campus from what we presume is a potential contractor under said RFP, with a Greenwood, IN mailing address. The owner of the Scotland Campus is MSLH, LLC, a Pennsylvania-registered limited liability company with a mailing address in Lakewood, NJ. Greene Township has responded in due course to those zoning inquiries stating that the proposed use is not consistent with the uses permitted in the Low-Density Residential (R-1) Zoning District (where the Scotland Campus is located).

There is no plan, proposal, application or submission from any party regarding the Scotland Campus for Greene Township to act upon at this time, nor has the Township been alerted to expect one.

Greene Township and its building code inspectors have been diligently monitoring the safety of the Scotland Campus buildings for the past several years as conditions have deteriorated and have issued several Notices of Violation regarding unsafe structures and unsanitary conditions. Greene Township will continue to vigorously enforce Pennsylvania building code requirements.

Anyone wishing to provide public comment on this matter may do so during the Public Comment period set forth on the agenda, but each speaker will be limited to three (3) minutes.
